
I was so proud to see the overwhelmingly positive feedback that came from the recent survey at parents evening, which was centred around the dedication and high levels of care and attentiveness of the staff. If I'm able to support them to continue to deliver a great education to our children then it is time well spent!

The importance of good attendance at school.

Regular attenders make better social and academic progress. They find school

routines, school work and friendships easier and learning more satisfying. Regular attenders are also more successful when transferring between schools and when entering employment. For children to take full advantage of the educational opportunities offered it is vital for pupils to be at school, on time, every day the school is open unless the reason for the absence is unavoidable (e.g. illness).

Furthermore, persistent lateness can have a detrimental effect as children miss vital learning and instruction at the beginning of the school day. Please remember, therefore, that the school day begins between 8.45am and 8.55am and that arrival after this time will be recorded as 'late'. In line



with the school's attendance policy, arrival after registers have closed at 9.15am will result in an unauthorised absence which, over time, could result in a Penalty Notice (as can an unauthorised absence for 10 or more morning and/or afternoon sessions).
