As you know, we have recently introduced a new learning character this term. The new character is called *Considerate Hedgehog* and the teachers and myself have been talking to the children about what it means to be considerate to others. Please do follow this up at home and I am always happy to hear about how your children have been considerate at home and towards you and the rest of your family. Do catch me at drop off or pick up with any lovely examples of children being considerate.

COVID UPDATES.

- Should you or your children test positive using a lateral flow test, you must then book a PCR test. The result of the PCR test will then supersede the lateral flow test result.
- Should you or your children test positive after a PCR test, you will have to engage with NHS Track and Trace in order to identify any close contacts.
- Should a child test positive, we will deem any close contacts to be any children or any adults in the same class.
- Children or double vaccinated adults will <u>not</u> need to self-isolate if identified as a close contact. Instead, it is recommended that identified close contacts have a PCR test.
- We will notify you should a child or adult test positive within your child's class.

- On PE days please can any earrings be removed and school sweatshirts worn.
- Please remember to name your child's uniform and PE kit.
- As the weather gets colder, please can your child wear a named coat to school.
