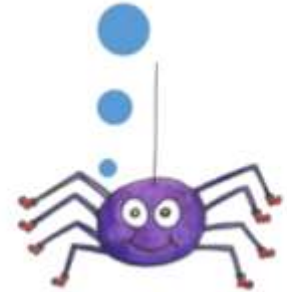
Curious Cat
