Mathematics

3-4 year olds will learn to...

- Understand position through words alone.
 For example 'The bag is under the table'-with no pointing
- Describe a familiar route.
- Discuss routes ad locations, using words like 'in front of' and 'behind'.

Understanding the World

3-4 year olds will learn to...

- Use all their senses in hands on exploration of natural materials.
- Begin to understand the need to respect and care for the natural environment and all living things.
- Know that there are different countries in the world and talk about the differences they have experienced or seen in photos.

Understanding the World

Children in Reception will learn to...

Locational

- Make observations about where things are in school or local area.
- Use maps and images to gain a basic locational knowledge about individual places and environments, especially the local area, but also in the UK and wider world.
- Name, locate and describe the four countries of the UK and the surrounding seas.

Locational

- Can investigate their surroundings and make appropriate observations.
- Has a simple locational knowledge about individual places and environments, especially the local area.
- Can name the world's seven continents and five oceans.

Place Knowledge

- Shows simple understanding by describing the places and features they study using some geographical language.
- Is beginning to identify some similarities and differences, and simple patterns in the environment.

Place Knowledge

- Shows more confident understanding by describing the places and features they study using simple geographical language.
- Can identify some similarities and differences, and simple patterns in the environment – concentrating on islands and sea-sides

- Draw information from a simple map.
- Recognise some differences and similarities between life in this country and life in other countries.
- Explore the natural world around them.
- Recognise some environments that are different to the one in which they live.

People, Culture and Communities ELG

- Describe their immediate environment using knowledge from observation, discussion, stories, non-fiction texts and maps.
- Know some similarities and differences between different religious and cultural communities in this country, drawing on own experience and what has been read in class.
- Explain some similarities and differences between life in this country and life in other countries, drawing on knowledge from stories, non-fiction texts, and where appropriate, maps.

The Natural World ELG

- Know some similarities and differences between the natural world around them and contrasting environments, drawing upon own experience and what has been read in class.
- Understand some important processes and changes in the natural world around them

 including the seasons and changing states of matter.

- Begin to identify seasonal and daily weather patterns in the UK
- Begin to locate hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the Equator, North and South Pole.
- Beginning to use some basic geographical vocabulary to refer to physical features and human features.
