Attendance As part of June's newsletter, I wanted to make you aware of the importance of good attendance at school. Regular attenders make better social and academic progress. They find school routines, school work and friendships easier and learning more satisfying. Regular attenders are also more successful when transferring between schools and when entering employment. For children to take full advantage of the educational opportunities offered it is vital for pupils to be at school, on time, every day the school is open unless the reason for the absence is unavoidable (e.g. illness). Furthermore, persistent lateness can have a detrimental effect as children miss vital learning and instruction at the beginning of the school day. Please remember, therefore, that the school day begins between 8.45am and 8.55am and that arrival after this time will be recorded as 'late'. In line with Hampshire County Council's attendance policy, arrival after 9.30am will result in an unauthorised absence which, over time, could result in a Penalty Notice (as can an unauthorised absence for 10 or more morning and/or afternoon sessions). Did you know that?

Walking is great for mental health as it releases feel good hormones which can help boost mood and help children to start the day more calmly.



- Nine in ten teachers in a recent government survey, consider that the walk to school makes children more alert and ready for the day ahead!
- Young people starting secondary school are less likely to be involved in road accidents if they have had previous experience of walking to school .
- During the morning rush hour, more than 1 in 5 cars on the road are taking children to school and contributing to congestion, air pollution and carbon emissions.
- Driving to school can have significant cost implications as families can spend over £300 annually on the school run.
